## - FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR -

Let's talk "carbon" (as in greenhouse gas and climate change). You've heard me say that NEBC member firms are the ones others will look to for solutions to this accelerating environmental issue. Now NEBC is stepping up to advance the dialogue. At the urging of members, we will be hosting a conference this fall titled "Managing Carbon: Policy and Practice." Going beyond government policy, regulations, and cap & trade mechanisms, this one-day conference will focus on helping companies understand what they can begin doing *now* to measure and manage their carbon footprints. Policy will be addressed, as it sets the context for decision makers. But the goal is to get as practical and hands-on as possible. Planning has just gotten under way, so if your firm has a practice that helps companies address this issue, please let me know. The date is November 14, in Portland. Mark your calendars and stay tuned for details.

The Oregon legislative has wrapped up this year's session, and despite the proclamations of substantial environmental achievements, the results were uneven. Especially disappointing was the failure of the Environmental Enhancement Tax Credit bill that NEBC helped author and promote. This bill was a replacement for the expiring Pollution Control Tax Credit (PCTC) and had a core component rewarding companies for taking actions going "beyond compliance." Early on, NEBC partnered with Oregon Business Association on this bill, and we were later joined by Associated Oregon Industries (forming a remarkable and broad-based business coalition). We also worked with DEQ staff to assure that the bill was workable and solved problems tied to the PCTC. Although there was strong support on both the House and Senate floors, the bill failed to get through a crucial committee before the clock ran out. The bill was opposed by several environmental organizations which, I'll just say, have a different perspective on the challenges facing businesses than the proponents have. We continue to believe that supporting voluntary environmental enhancements is good economic policy, and we'll be back next session.

Despite the outcome, I want to express my appreciation to Joan Snyder of Stoel Rives, whose work on the bill was critical to it getting as far as it did. Joan worked on the bill from the start, and when the rest of us got lost in the thickets of legislative language and amendments, she pushed on through. She also made several trips to Salem to testify on behalf of the bill. Thank you Joan. That's what a membership organization is all about.

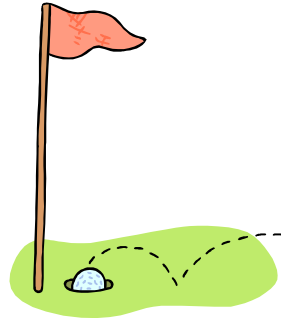
