

- FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR -

“Collaboration” sounds good, but is not always easy to put into practice. Still, collaboration is a key part of NEBC’s strategy for providing value to its members. Collaboration – or partnering – doesn’t mean that we always agree with the other organization’s positions. And there are even times when the partner organization could be seen as a “competitor” for memberships or event income. Nonetheless, we collaborate when we find opportunities where partnering will mutually benefit our constituencies. This can range from promoting each others’ activities, to joint advocacy, to full economic partnership on an event.

For example, each year in Washington we partner with Association of Washington Business on the Northwest Environmental Summit. We help plan the event, but AWB runs the conference portion and NEBC runs the trade show. The Northwest Environmental Conference in Oregon follows the same model, with Associated Oregon Industries as the conference lead. This past year we also partnered with both AWB and AOI to push legislative issues important to our industry – despite the fact that at other times we disagree. The same goes for environmental organizations such as Climate Solutions and Oregon Environmental Council.

In the recent past, we partnered on educational programs with the Air and Waste Management Association, have lobbied alongside the Oregon Business Association, and supported the Wildlife Habitat Council when their national conference came to Seattle. This just scratches the surface. In fact, we are always looking for opportunities to partner with other groups on events and policy initiatives. At the moment, we are working on events with Oregon

Science and Technology Partnership, and exploring collaboration opportunities with the National Brownfields Association, North American Hazardous Materials Management Association, and the Manufacturing Industrial Council of Seattle. We also collaborate with private companies when appropriate. And then there are the numerous government agencies (regulatory, policy, and economic development), plus local and state business groups, with whom we engage on a regular basis.

To me, this sums up the power of a trade association like NEBC. By being clear about our mission of supporting the business interests of our members, we can be flexible in how we operate and who we work with. The more “friends” we have, the more opportunities we can offer, and the greater our reach and influence on issues that are important to us.

It will cover recent developments in greenhouse gas reduction policy, as well as the practical steps that companies are taking right now to reduce their carbon footprints. 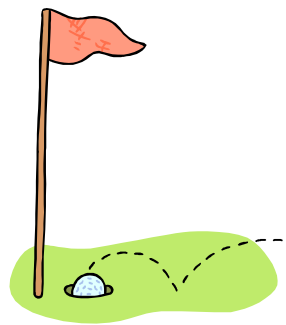
